Art	 Art - Mosaic Art- Anton Gaudi Gaudi is a famous Architect and artist from the Catalan part of Spain. He is well known for his examples of Mosaic Art in different buildings around Barcelona, see the picture attached (SEESAW) What is mosaic Art? A Mosaic is a pattern or image made of small regular or irregular pieces of colored stone, glass or ceramic, held in place by plaster/mortar, and covering a surface. It is the art one often sees in churches using tiny tiles, and is very similar to 'stained glass'. It can also be done using paper. Draw a mosaic pattern of a flower/animal of your choice. First draw the overall picture (example a daffodil), then break it into sections, each a different colour. Fill each section with coloured paper, assorted paints /colours, If feeling adventurous, try eggshells and paint afterwards! (see butterfly in example picture)
