Recounts

Purpose: to retell events, telling what happened, a sequence of events

Examples	Structure	Language Features
<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Personal story- Diary- Experiment- Retelling events- A biography or autobiography- Newspaper article	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- A 'scene setting' opening- Recount of events as they occurred- In chronological order- A closing statement summing up the main points	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Past tense- First or Third person- Use conjunctions- Focus on specific people or events, not general topics

Here's an example of one from my house to give you an idea. ● <i>Start at the gate, stand facing the house.</i> ● <i>Run straight ahead until you reach the large rock on the left hand side.</i> ● <i>Turn 90 degrees to the right.</i> ● <i>Walk straight ahead ten paces. You should be at the daffodils.</i> ● <i>Turn 90 degrees to the left.</i> ● <i>Hop on one foot until you reach the path.</i> ● <i>Jump up onto the path and back down off it ten times.</i> ● <i>Find the green flower pot nearby and the treasure will be inside!</i> ● <i>Bonus points on the journey if you can find something brown, something colourful, something hard, something soft, something smelly.</i> <p><i>(You might hide a treat or a prize in the final place for your participants to find).</i></p>
