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## How To Plant A Sunflower Seed

**What you need:**

- A small pot
- Soil
- Seeds
- Watering can
- Water

**What you do:**

1. Fill the pot with soil to just below the top.
2. Add a little water to the soil.
3. Gently press one or two seeds into the soil.
4. Cover the seeds with a small amount of soil.
5. Carefully pour more water onto the soil.

 Water the soil everyday to help your sunflower grow.
