Finances

During the 2017/18 school year the Board of Management of the school has undertaken its duties in a number of areas. The Board has made funds available to the Principal teacher and staff to enhance and improve the resources in the school across a variety of subject areas. Finances are reviewed and certified annually by an independent accountant annually. Sean Hennessey and Margot Quigley (secretary) assist with this process.

Staffing

In June 2017 a new shared SET position was created. This resulted in a permanent teaching vacancy becoming available. The school engaged with the supplementary panel (as per Circular 17/2017) and Ms. Áine Whelan was appointed to the school staff. We have clustered with Davidstown NS, Ballycullane NS, Bunscoil Rís and Taghmon NS to create this post.

As well as involvement in all curricular planning, staff accept other responsibilities:

The In-School Management team comprises Mr. Gallagher, Mrs. Doyle and Ms. McGrath (Assistant Principal II post holder). This team meets regularly and carries out extra duties/responsibilities for curricular, organisational and pastoral care areas. The principal and deputy principal meet on a formal basis regularly.

Attendance

Our attendance rate was 93.8%. 11 pupils missed over 20 days while 5 pupils had full attendance. Attendance records are kept using Aladdin, the school's administration system. Annual returns were made to Túsla regarding attendance. All attendance records are being kept electronically as per DES Circular 0033/2015.

Our projected enrolment for September 2017 is 132. There are 13 6th class pupils transitioning to secondary school and 16 new entrants for September 2017.

During the summer 2017, the school had availed of Summer Works Grant to update its heating system throughout the school. This work was carried out expertly by Jim Ryan. Continued Professional Development

The Board has supported ongoing professional development of teachers. All teachers in the school have undertaken professional development in a wide variety of areas such as ICT, Special Education Needs, PST training and Wellbeing.

Parents Association

This year, with assistance from the Parents' Association and the greater parent body, we purchased 10 iPads for the school. These are an invaluable resource for use in the classroom. The Parents Association play a vital role in school life in Courtnacuddy organising events such as Halloween Disco, Christmas Fair, Sports Evening etc. The main fundraiser this year was to help raise money to fund the installation of warning lighting on the approach to the school. The Board extends its thanks to the Parents' Association for all the support it gives the school particularly in the area of fundraising.
