#### Finances

During the 2018/19 school year the Board of Management of the school has undertaken its duties in a number of areas. The Board has made funds available to the Principal teacher and staff to enhance and improve the resources in the school across a variety of subject areas.

Finances are reviewed and certified annually by an independent accountant annually. Sean Hennessey and Margot Quigley (secretary) assist with this process.

The In-School Management team comprises Mr. Gallagher, Mrs. Doyle, Ms. McGrath (Assistant Principal II post holder) and Mrs Catherine O'Brien (Assistant Principal II). This team meets regularly and carries out extra duties/responsibilities for curricular, organisational and pastoral care areas. The principal and deputy principal meet on a formal basis regularly.

#### Attendance

Our attendance rate was 94.7%. Only 6 pupils missed over 20 days while 7 pupils had full attendance. Attendance records are kept using Aladdin, the school's administration system. Annual returns were made to Túsla regarding attendance. All attendance records are being kept electronically as per DES Circular 0033/2015.

Our projected enrolment for September 2019 is 131. There are 17 6<sup>th</sup> class pupils transitioning to secondary school and 14 new entrants for September 2019.

The Board has supported ongoing professional development of teachers. All teachers in the school have undertaken professional development in a wide variety of areas such as ICT, Special Education Needs, Literacy & Numeracy and Physical Education.

# **Parents Association**

These are an invaluable resource for use in the classroom. Fundraising money was also used to purchase Yard furniture and Sports equipment in addition to resources for use in the SEN setting.
