Finances

During the 2019/20 school year the Board of Management of the school has undertaken its duties in a number of areas. The Board has made funds available to the Principal teacher and staff to enhance and improve the resources in the school across a variety of subject areas. Aladdin ePayments has been set up and will be operational from September to make payments easier for parents. Accounts for 18/19 submitted to FSSU. Finances are reviewed and certified annually by an independent accountant annually. Sean Hennessey and Margot Quigley (secretary) assist with this process.

Staffing

We have clustered with Davidstown NS, Ballycullane NS and Ballaghkeene NS to create the shared SET post this year

Ms Kickham tendered her resignation in January to take up a principalship. Pauline Lehane covered her leave from March to June. Bertie Gahan was taken off the Supplementary Panel to replace Ms Kickham. Mrs Doyle notified the Board of her intention to retire in October after 40 yrs teaching in Courtnacuddy. Stephanie Roche was taken from Supplementary Panel to replace Catherine from 4th October.

The In-School Management team comprises Mr. Gallagher, Mrs. Doyle, Ms. McGrath (Assistant Principal II post holder) and Mrs Catherine O'Brien (Assistant Principal II). This team meets regularly and carries out extra duties/responsibilities for curricular, organisational and pastoral care areas. The principal and deputy principal meet on a formal basis regularly.

Attendance

Our attendance rate was 95.1%. Only 3 pupils missed over 20 days while 16 pupils had full attendance up to 12th March when school closed. Attendance records are kept using Aladdin, the school's administration system. Annual returns were made to Túsla regarding attendance. All attendance records are being kept electronically as per DES Circular 0033/2015.

Our projected enrolment for September 2020 is 130. There are 16 6th class pupils transitioning to secondary school and 15 new entrants for September 2019.

The Board has supported ongoing professional development of teachers. All teachers in the school have undertaken professional development in a wide variety of areas such as ICT, Special Education Needs, Literacy & Numeracy and Physical Education.

Parents Association

This year, with assistance from the Parents' Association and the greater parent body, we purchased additional iPads. These are an invaluable resource for use in the classroom. Science equipment has also been sourced and will be purchased in the new year. Fundraising money was also used to purchase Sports equipment in addition to resources for use in the SEN setting. The Parents Association also funded a workshop from Brickz4Kidz as part of Engineers Week. The Parents Association play a vital role in school life in Courtnacuddy organising events such as Halloween Disco, Christmas Fair, Sports Evening etc. The Board extends its thanks to

the Parents' Association for all the support it gives the school particularly in the area of fundraising.
